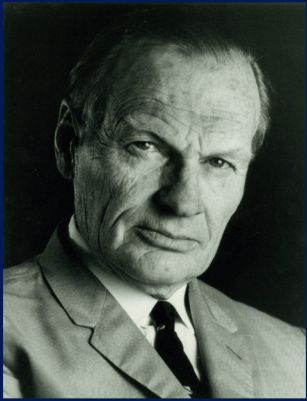

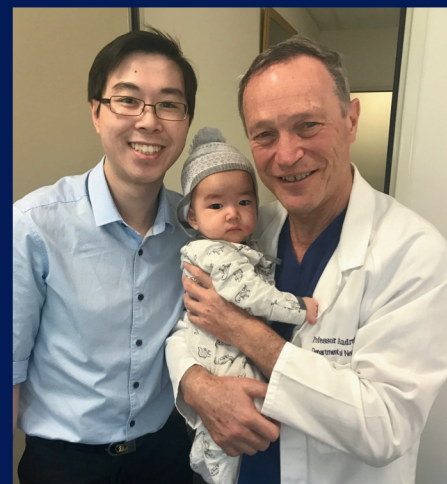

History

- 1945** Establishment under direction of R.S. Hooper
Specialised department of Neurosurgery established at The Royal Melbourne Hospital
- 1956** J.B. Curtis appointed second Director
J.B. Curtis was one of the first to introduce cerebral angiography, using a carotid puncture technique
- 1975** D. Brownbill appointed third Director
Longest serving Director of Neurosurgery
- 1984** Brain tumour research program established
First focused on development of photodynamic therapy for glioma
- 1992** World-renowned Head of Department
Professor Andrew Kaye AM appointed Director of Neurosurgery
- 1993** Fellowship program
Introduction of Senior Fellow posts for overseas neurosurgeons to join The Royal Melbourne Hospital
- 1994** Journal of Clinical Neuroscience
Establishment of the Journal of Clinical Neuroscience, the official journal for major Australasian and Asian neuroscience societies
- 2004** First Controversies in Neurosurgery conference
Biennial meeting, now the largest in Australia, and host to countless stellar international guests
- 2011** Melbourne Brain Centre @ RMH established
Premier translational research hub, bringing together experts in diverse aspects of neurosurgical disease
- 2015** New scanner for advanced surgery
Intraoperative MRI scanner installed, enabling surgeons to image patients while undergoing surgery
- 2017** First female Head of Department
Professor Kate Drummond AM appointed Director of Neurosurgery
- 2021** Australia's best research minds
Proud research partner of The Brain Cancer Centre, established so that no lives are lost to brain cancer
